recognized Miriam "Mim" Meyer for her commitment to caring and providing compassion to patients. During a ceremony, the Nursing Honor Guard highlighted her career and individual achievements. In addition to a plaque, Mim received a Florence Nightingale pin in honor of her long and excellent service to the community.

"We are recognizing Mim to commemorate her service as a nurse and a leader." said Debbie Meadows, RN, director of Clinical Services at Ohio's Hospice LifeCare. "We are honoring her for

a lifetime of service to the welfare of our community through nursing."

Mim graduated from the School of Nursing at Goshen College in Goshen, Indiana, with a bachelor's degree in 1955. Nursing was a calling for her, and she worked in Pennsylvania, Arkansas and Ohio. Much of her career was spent in public health nursing, including 15 years as a nurse in the Akron and Barberton communities.

Mim also used her nursing abilities in service to her family, providing caregiving for her parents and her husband's parents.

Mim's daughter, Mary Wiebe, followed in her mother's footsteps as a nurse. Wiebe described how her mother made all who met her feel loved, accepted and valued, especially those who were less fortunate.

"As Mom so compassionately and lovingly carried out her tasks and responsibilities, one never heard a demeaning word pass through her lips," Wiebe said. "She was a true encourager, lifting up all who had the blessing of crossing paths with her."

Construction on the Marilyn B. and Mark E. **Gustafson Center for Supportive Care is expected** to be completed during the spring of 2022. The center will allow Ohio's Hospice LifeCare to expand our volunteer services, the Pathways of HopeSM Grief Counseling Center, and our Mobile Care Unit transportation hub of service and support.

Since 1982, we have had the honor and privilege to care for those in our community as they face the end of life. Our care team of physicians, nurses, personal care specialists, chaplains, social workers, bereavement counseling professionals, and volunteers support around-the-clock care for more patients and families than ever before.

The Center for Supportive Care will provide more individual and group counseling rooms for our Pathways of Hope Grief Counseling Center, a larger gathering space for training and seminars for both volunteers and the community, office space, and garages built for our Mobile Care Unit transportation hub of service and support. We look forward to this addition to our Akron Road location serving the community.
